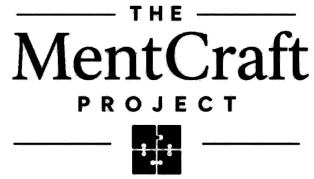

How to Get the Most Out of This Book

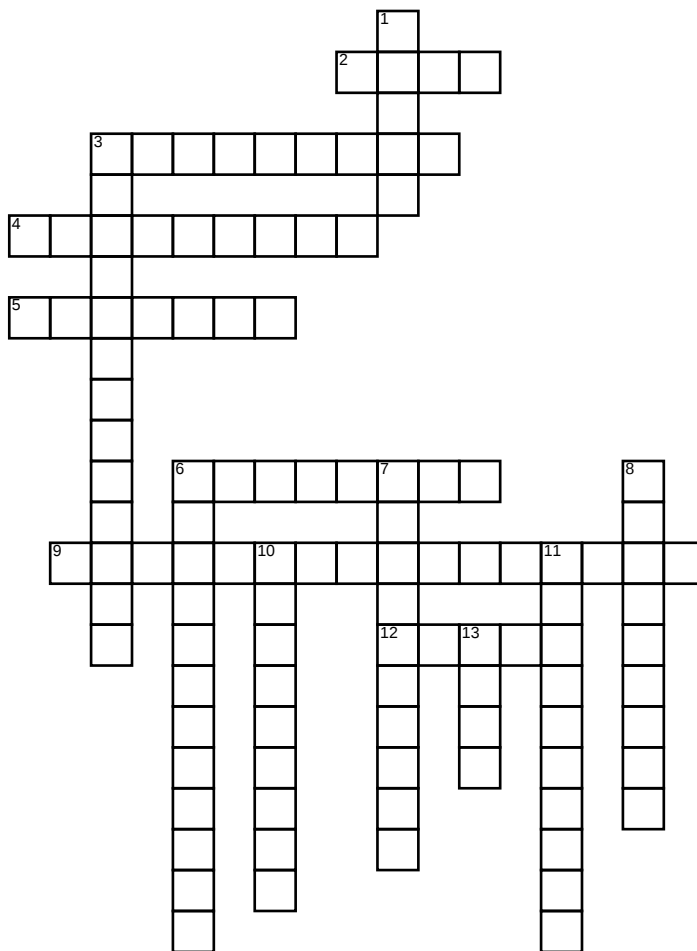

Glossary

ACCELERATE: To increase speed, especially of a vehicle.

ACCELERATION: The rate of change of velocity over time.

ACCELERATOR: A pedal or lever used to increase the speed of an engine, especially in a car.

ACCESSIBILITY: The state of being easily reached or entered, particularly in the context of facilities for people with disabilities.

ACCESSIBLE: Easy to approach, reach, enter, or use by everyone including those with disabilities.

ACCIDENT: An unfortunate event that happens unexpectedly and unintentionally, often causing damage or injury.

ACCOMMODATION: A place where someone may live or stay temporarily.

ACTUATOR: A mechanical device that moves or controls a mechanism based on an electrical signal.

ADVENTURE: An exciting or unusual experience, typically involving some risk.

AEROBATICS: The practice of flying aircraft in maneuvers involving acrobatic techniques.

AERODROME: A site from which aircraft flight operations take place, including airports and landing strips.

AERODYNAMIC: Relating to the study of the properties of moving air and the interaction between gas and solid objects.

AERODYNAMICIST: An engineer or scientist who specializes in the study of aerodynamics.

AERODYNAMICS: The study of how gases interact with moving bodies, particularly in relation to flight.

AERONAUTICAL: Relating to the science or practice of travel through the air, especially in an aircraft.

AEROPLANE: A powered flying vehicle with fixed wings and a weight greater than that of the air it displaces.

AEROSPACE: The airspace and the space beyond it, including the atmosphere and outer space.

AEROSTAT: A lighter-than-air craft such as a balloon or blimp.

AFT: Toward the stern of a ship; behind.

AIRBAG: An inflatable cushion in a vehicle designed to protect occupants from injury in case of a collision.

AIRBRIDGE: A movable bridge connecting an airport terminal to an aircraft.

AIRBRIDGES: Movable bridges connecting airport terminals directly to aircraft.

AIRCRAFT: A vehicle capable of flight.

AIRFARE: The price paid for a seat on an aircraft.

AIRFIELDS: Areas equipped for aircraft takeoffs, landings, and ground operations.

AIRFREIGHT: Cargo transported by air.

AIRLINE: A company that provides air transport services.

AIRLOCK: An airtight chamber used to allow passage between different pressure zones.

AIRMAIL: Mail transported by aircraft.

AIRPORT: A facility where aircraft take off and land.

AIRSHIP: A large aircraft kept aloft by buoyancy.

AIRSHOW: An exhibition of aircraft maneuvers.

AIRSICK: Feeling nauseated due to motion in the air.

AIRSPACE: The portion of the atmosphere used for flight.

AIRSPEED: The speed of an aircraft relative to the surrounding air.

AIRSTRIPE: A short, unpaved strip for aircraft landings.

AIRWORTHINESS: The condition of being fit for safe flight.

ALIGHTING: The act of disembarking from a vehicle.

ALTERNATOR: An electrical generator in a vehicle's engine.

ALTITUDE: The height of an object or point in relation to sea level or ground level.

AMBLE: To walk at a slow, relaxed pace.

AMBLING: Moving at a slow pace.

AMBULANCE: A vehicle designed for transporting sick or injured people to a medical facility.

ANCHOR: A heavy device used to secure a ship's position.

ANCHORAGE: A safe place for ships to anchor.

ARCHIPELAGO: A group of islands clustered together.

ARRIVALS: Flights or passengers reaching an airport.

ARTICULATED: Having a pivoting joint, as in a bus, to allow for greater maneuverability.

ASTRONAUTICS: The science and technology of space flight.

ATLAS: A book of maps or charts.

ATMOSPHERE: The gaseous envelope surrounding a planet.

ATTRACTION: A place of interest that tourists visit.

ATTRACTIONS: Places or activities that draw visitors for interest or enjoyment.

AUTOBUS: A large motor vehicle designed to carry many passengers, typically along a fixed route.

AUTOMOBILE: A vehicle designed for road travel, typically having four wheels and powered by an internal combustion engine.

AUTONOMOUS: Operating independently without human intervention.

AUTOPILOT: A system that allows a vehicle to fly or drive itself.

AVALANCHE: A mass of snow, ice, and rocks falling rapidly down a mountainside or cliff.

AVENUE: A broad road in a town or city.

AVIATION: The design, development, and operation of aircraft.

AXLE: A central shaft for a rotating wheel or gear.
